27TH ANNIVERSARY LITERARY AWARDS AND EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS FUNCTION

The function was held on February 14, 2011 at the Walchand Hirachand Hall of the Indian Merchants' Chamber in front of a jampacked audience of over 300. Literary Awards were presented for work in four Indian languages, over 200 students were given scholarships, and Dr. Kulin Kothari, prominent Ophthalmologist, was felicitated for his outstanding humanitarian contribution to providing eye care for the disadvantaged.

Shri Dilip Valse Patil, Hon'ble Speaker of the Maharashtra Legislative Assembly, was the Guest of Honour, and Dr. Indu Shahani, Hon'ble Sheriff of Mumbai, the Special Guest.

Shri Nanik Rupani, Chairman, Priyadarshni Academy, gave the Welcome Address during which he expressed deep satisfaction that the Academy was able to consistently expand the number of scholarships it gave to the financially needy and deserving students. He particularly thanked Mr. Nihchal Israni, Chairman of the Academy's Educational Scholarships Committee, for his unstinted and generous support whereby the Academy has decided to expand the number of scholarships next year to 500.

Each literay award carried a Memento and a purse of Rs 25,000. The scholarships were generally for Rs.10000 each.

to donate for social causes is good for India. Their American-style presentation for the latter objective drew criticism from Indian philanthropists and other commentators, but they have left Indian leaders some good food for thought. Indians have been philanthropists traditionally. While some have come out recently with large donations for good causes, the philanthropic thinking is yet to catch on in a big way in modern India.

NGOs usually raise money for their own activities. Priyadarshni Academy has always been a giving entity in terms of student scholarships, promoting the arts and other activities among the youth, and recognizing national and global achievers. The Academy went one step further preceding the Buffet visit and donated a sizeable 25 lakhs to develop a library and a chemistry laboratory to benefit children of the 2007-established Sadhu Vaswani International School, Not only that, it will associate itself closely with the development of the library in the years to come by way of suggesting books for its collections and ideas to use the library as a multi-purpose knowledge centre.

The Academy also donated for an eye camp and assured help to 30 financially needy patients to get their eyes operated to regain better sight.

The Academy is proud to be able to help in so many different ways as what it has done is only an extension of what it has done through all its 27 years.

The Academy had a rousing Literary Awards and Scholarships program during the quarter and also essayed into a new style of program under its dance project. It collaborated with Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan in Australia to present a Bharata Natyam performance to an Indian-Australian audience. While doing so, it stepped out of the national integration rubric and entered into an international integration arena. While the Rain Gods intervened resulting in a cancellation of the second performance, the first went well. There will be two more similar events in Australia later in the year.

A Gold Medalist from Calcutta University, writer Ms. Sudha Arora's forte is the short story genre. She has some 80 acclaimed short stories to her credit. Her works have been widely translated into various Indian and foreign languages (French, Polish, Czech, Japanese, Dutch, Italian, German, Taziki, and English).

Some of her stories have been adapted for television and stage by the Experimental Theatre of London, Prague, and Rome.

Ms. Arora has authored eight short story collections and a novel. Her collection 'Yuddhaviram' won a special award from Uttar Pradesh Hindi Sansthan in 1978. She received the Bharat Nirman Literature Award in 2008.

Marathi Literary Award

Geeta Israni Memorial Marathi Literary Award was presented to Mr. Rajan Khan for his latest novel RAS ANAURAS (Akshar Prakashan, Mumbai, 2010). Mr. Khan is a prolific writer of novels, short stories, and a journalist and editor for a number of magazines and publications. His other important works are SCREEN TEST, KAFAR, YATIM, EK LEKHAK KHARCH JALA, KASAK, SAHYA SARE ASE CHALOO AAHE, PIDDHI, and AJAB GAJAB JAGANE WAGANE. He has also written for the theater and cinema. Some of his stories have been translated in Hindi, English and Kannada, Mr. Rajan Khan has received numerous awards for his work as a novelist, story writer, playwright, and script writer including the Maharashtra Government Award, the Maharashtra Sahitya Parishad Award, the Jaywant Dalvi Award, the Akhil Bharatiya Marathi Patrakar Parishad Award, the P. L. Deshpande Smruti Rajvastariy Natyamahotsav, et al. He is the President of a number of literary and cultural organizations and a noted social activist.

Sindhi Literary Award

Laxmi-Nari Pohani Sindhi Literary Award was presented to Mr. Vasdev Mohi. Mr. Mohi is a prominent Sindhi writer. He was a Lecturer and Head of the Department of English at the Indian High School, Dubai. Mr. Mohi has a number of publications to his credit, including poetry collections, and publications in Gujarati and Hindi.

He has also contributed to the Handbook of

Post-partition Sindhi Ghazals. He has won the Sahitya Akademy Award (1999) for Barf Jo Thahyal; Kishinchand Bewas Award, Gujarat Sahitya Academy (1995) for Mankoo; Narayan Shyam Award for Best Mumbai (1997); the Sindhi Sahitya Academy, Gujarat State Translation Prize for Antural (2010), and NCPSL'S (HRD Ministry, New Delhi) Sahitkar Sanman Life Time Achievement Award (2010).

Mr. Mohi has led a Writers' Delegation to China arranged by Sahitya Akademy, New Delhi.

Gujarati Literary Award

Smt. Chandaben Mohanbhai Patel Gujarati Literary Award was presented to Dr. Yashwant Trivedi. Dr. Trivedi has published 126 books mainly on literature, criticism, politics, creative writing, philosophy, and religion. He has won 13 awards and prizes. They include the Sur Singar Samsad's National Award for Post Independence Poetry, Soviet Land Nehru Award, five Sahitya Akademy Prizes, Gujarati Sahitya Parishad Award, 1st Prize in Kavilok, Best Laureate Award for Enriching Indian Literature, Sheriff Dr. Mohanbhai Patel Saraswati Sanman Award, and Life Time Achievement Award from Human Society of India. He has 31 years' post-graduate and M. Phil. teaching experience.

Educational Scholarship

The former is the most comprehensive eye care institute in Western India and is staffed by specialists in every field of ophthalmology and fully equipped with state-of-the-art diagnostic and surgical equipment. It renders services in keeping with the highest international norms, practices and standards and is a centre of repute for training eye surgeons.

Shri Dilip Valse Patil, in his speech, emphasized the need to reduce the rate of school dropouts. He urged that institutions should provide more and more vocational training, as he argued that the work place in India lacks personnel with application skills. In her address, Dr. Indu Shahani encouraged the youth to involve themselves as change makers for a "Better India". She urged the educated youth to channelise their energies to bring out a desirable change in the lives of the underprivileged. She gave examples with pride of three of her own students who were bringing about significant such changes. She also hoped that the Academy in the near future would be able to give scholarships to everyone who applied, which would be possible if more philanthropists supported the academy.
