ANNA HAZARE'S ANTI-CORRUPTION MOVEMENT STIRS THE NATION INTO ACTION – PRIYADARSHNI ACADEMY CO-HOSTS BABA RAMDEV ADDRESS ON THE SUBJECT

t the time of writing this piece, Anna Hazare's anti-corruption movement has captured the imagination of the entire Indian populace. Young and old, from the far corners of India, are thronging in growing numbers and joining the protest movement in traditional and novel ways. And, quite rightly so. India has wilted under the grip of corruption for years and it has affected our growth in all its aspects. We hope that the movement will take giant steps forward, without pause, until we move firmly

towards a corrupt-free India to adopt better values and include growth for all of our poor. It is important that all of us get behind Anna Hazare's movement as it will have a tremendous impact on the well-being of our society.

Your Academy, in its very early years, created a slogan, "Corruption is Cancer, Let us Fight It

Together" and has publicized it at every opportunity. Recently, its Chairman, Mr. Nanik Rupani, made use of an occasion to be part of the committee which organized a power-packed presentation on the very subject of anti-corruption, by Baba Ramdev, an avid supporter of Anna Hazare's movement. In his address, Ramdevji also spoke about Yoga and its eternal values. The program was held on May 3, 2011 at the Shankukhananda Hall and was attended by a jam-packed audience.

Ramdevji lambasted the government openly and boldly for its failure to bring back black money stashed away in foreign accounts. He spoke in-depth on the subject, citing thoroughly researched figures and statistics. He declared his determination to fight corruption until it ended. His emphatic statement was that the retrieval of black money would save our nation of much misery.

While speaking about Yoga, Baba Ramdev emphasized that Yoga is a mind-body discipline that

can change an individual physically, mentally and spiritually. When practiced correctly, it has the ability to heal and transform. He demonstrated a few breathing exercises and focused on the biological significance of the respiration process. He said that through the practice of proper breathing, the balance of oxygen and carbon dioxide is attained.



Ramdevji said, "Today's life is full of stress. Because of the daily work, and family or financial pressures, we tend to ignore our breathing. Thus, it tends to be fast and shallow. Both events should be worth looking forward to. One is slated to be held in September and the other in November. Details are being worked out and will be announced to members in due course.

The Academy has gone through difficulties in its early sojourn, as all organizations have, but we have overcome them successfully, and have risen to great heights mainly because of the strength and support lent by our members and well-wishers. VIGNETTES FROM THE ACADEMY'S HISTORY

A couple of months ago, the Sindhi Circle of Jai Hind College, celebrated its annual function and Priyadarshni Academy co-sponsored it. At the event, the famous Kathak danseuse, Ms. Anila Sunder, and her troupe, performed a beautiful dance ballet "ZAAL...Kadhan Zer, Kadhan Zabar!" depicting the different facets of a woman's life. Veteran members of the Academy will remember that this very Anila Sunder

was instrumental in the birth of the Academy, which today stands as a true example of how a socio-cultural and educational organization should function in a developing country like India, with its vast social, cultural and spiritual diversity.

It was 1984. As a talented young artiste, Ms. Anila Sunder was trying to find expression to her talent. She was looking for a platform to showcase her abilities. She approached a group of like-minded individuals such as Mr. Rupani Mr. Murli Adnani, Prof. Popati Hiranandani, Mr. Jamnadas Lalwani, Ms. Kaushi Mirpuri, Mr. Ramkrishan Advani, Mr. Chander Manghnani, and Mr. Madhav Balwani for help. The group felt the need to figure a way out to promote Anila's talent. What resulted was a series of meetings and

discussions, and brainstorming. The group came to the conclusion that it was important to found an organization to serve the needs of artists and individuals in diverse fields. The moment of reckoning

soon arrived. The group formed an organization and gave it the evergreen name, Priyadarshni Academy.

Mr. Nanik Rupani, the Founder-Chairman of the Academy, had the inclination to help humanity right from his childhood. He realized that a formal platform is necessary to channelize efforts to serve humanity in a systematic and orderly manner. He has always held the view, "since we have taken so much from society, it is our


> duty to pay back." True to its name, Priyadarshni Academy adopted the motto, "Service to humanity is the best work of life."

In Memorium

Priyadarshni Academy lost a noble soul when Sushil Sain died on July 10, 2011. Sain was connected with the Academy from day one and was a pillar of

strength for the Academy right through its 27-year history. He was an active Advisor to the Academy's Educational Scholarships Committee until a few years ago when Parkinson's disease made it impossible for him to travel to meetings. Sain was not only bubbling with ideas for the Academy but also contributed generously to its activities. Even during his ailment, he followed the Academy's activities closely and had nothing but encouraging words for all that the Academy was involved in.

Professionally, Mr. Sain left a lasting impact as Chairman and Managing Director of the National Textile Commission. His dynamism helped make a significant contribution to the textile industry and helped take it to its helm. The Academy will miss Mr. Sain, but his name is deeply entrenched in the Academy's history.
