The event was covered live on the national DD News Channel, and as deferred live on the DD Sahyadri channel, and reached millions of viewers.

# MR. JIGNESH SHAH IS CHAIRMAN OF PRIYADARSHNI ACADEMY'S COMMITTEE FOR THE PROMOTION OF ORIENTAL STUDIES



Mr. Jignesh Shah, Chairman and Managing Director, Financial Technologies India Ltd., and recent recipient of Priyadarshni Academy's Global Award for Outstanding Contribution to Innovative Entrepreneurship (see story inside), is the Chairman of Priyadarshni Academy's recently established Committee for the Promotion of Oriental Studies.

The committee will launch publications on India's ancient masterpieces which have relevance to today's society. The objective is to delve deep into the classics and through publishing recreate awareness and interest in them among the public.

Mr. Shah has keen interest in sharing the wisdom of India's ancient masterpieces with the world. He appreciates the wisdom contained in *Kautilya's Arthashastra*, Mr. Shah is convinced that the practical value of Kautilya's wisdom can greatly benefit people from all walks of life, from all over the world.

Globally recognized as a pioneer and innovator in creating technology driven commodity and financial market infrastructure, Mr. Shah is a serial entrepreneur who has taken his Financial Technology Group from Rs 5 lacs in 1995 to Rs 10,000 crores in 2006, putting India on the global map of financial and commodity markets. He is well known for his practical business acumen at the grass roots level and is often described as 'The Face of New Generation Indian Entrepreneurs'.

Mr. Shah was honored with the prestigious MEDC 'Entrepreneur of the Year' award for 2005-06 by Chief Minister of Maharashtra, Shri Vilasrao Deshmukh. He also received the 'USA India Business Leader of the Year Award for 2005-06' by USINPAC in Washington DC, at the hands of Senator Hillary Clinton, for his contribution in helping integrate rural India with global markets.

Dr. Ram Tarneja, Chairman of the Global Awards Advisory Committee, spoke about the selection of awards. He expressed gratitude to all his colleagues on the Committee for supporting him, and described the importance and relevance of the fields in which awards were given and the criteria for selections.

**Shri Narayana Murthy**, who received the award for contrubution to the IT sector in his brief response, said, "I have a firm belief that this society has given me much more than I have been able to give it. This Award is yet another

affirmation of that belief. Your act of kindness, generosity, and affection will certainly be a great motivator for me to work harder and smarter. I thank you for this great honour."

Shri Jignesh Shah said, "It is a great pleasure to receive the award from an NGO. It gives me and my team great encouragement to drive our mission which we call 'Brand India Mission'. We have been using IT with great effect. And what we believe is that time has come when India must not only be recognized as the source of optimal or cheap labor, but as a world-class story with global valuations and global respectability. Using IT, we have created a commodity exchange. In less than 1000 days of the government allowing us to establish a commodity exchange in India, we could reach 1000 towns and a turnover of 10000 crores. Ours is in the first ten commodity exchanges out of 110 in the world. It is the second largest in the world in terms of gold trading and third largest in silver trading. This is in spite of the fact that there is no currency convertibility and the fact that banks, mutual funds, and FIIs are not allowed to trade in commodities, and further that India is yet to trade in options. This is the power of Retail India which we call Bharat."

The Singapore Kindness Movement was first conceived when then-Prime Minister Goh Chok Tong in his 1996 New Year message stressed the need to balance economic progress with a more caring, gentler society. Mr. Goh, who is now Singapore's Senior Minister, urged Singaporeans to upgrade not just their homes but also their social behaviour. By practicing basic qualities like care, consideration, and compassion - part of what he subsequently called a nation's heartware - we create more pleasant homes for our children and ourselves. To this end, the Movement was officially launched in January 1997. Our objectives are:

- To encourage Singaporeans to be kinder and more considerate;
- To raise public awareness of acts of kindness;
- To influence and raise the standards of social behaviour in our society.

"We cannot achieve these aims on our own. We, at the Singapore Kindness Movement, therefore work closely with youth organizations, schools, ministries, private corporations, the media, and members of the public to implement our programmes and further our campaigns.

'Similar movements have sprung up in many countries around the world. This is perhaps a reaction to the increasingly materialistic world that we have become. We cannot over-emphasize the need for greater kindness and social responsibility. With this in mind, the Singapore Kindness Movement, along with seven other countries (Australia, Canada, Japan, Scotland, Thailand, the United Kingdom and the United States), co-founded the World

Kindness Movement on 13 November, 1998. Today there are 20 members in 17 countries in the World Kindness Movement and, SKM continues to play an active role in its evolution by serving as its secretariat. India is represented in the World Kindness Movement Forum.

"Acts of kindness should be intrinsic to our daily lives. Everyone has the capacity to make others happy. All it takes is a simple smile, a nod of acknowledgement, or a wave of appreciation to make someone's day. At the end of his speech, Mr. Hon presented Shri Nanik Rupani a plaque and a scroll on behalf of the World Kindness Movement, in recognition of Priyadarshni Academy's activities, which Shri Rupani received at the hands of Shri Kamal Nath.

Amb. Olara Otunnu paid tribute to the Academy for its very important work, especially its emphasis on educating young people. He also paid tribute to the people of India. Africa, his continent, he said, had much to learn from India especially in the following three areas:

- In building democratic practices.
- In building national cohesion while celebrating diversity in terms of religion, ethnicity and cultures.
- In social and economic progress.

Amb. Otunnu continued: "I wish to dedicate this award to the children and women being destroyed in situation of war, and particularly at this moment, to the children and women of Darfur and Northern Uganda.

Mr. Otunnu made an urgent plea to world leaders to help stop the children and women of Darfur from being subjected to ethnic cleansing, rape, massacres and forced displacements. He also urged the audience present at the Global Awards programme to do so.

Mr. Otunnu passionately added: "We must retrieve a path of principled application of human rights. If we do not commit to one set of human rights for all victims, we undermine the credibility of human rights discourse for all victims. Human rights cannot be applied selectively, with an eye to political gain, for some rather than for all. We must denounce and act to stop genocide wherever it occurs, regardless of the ethnicity of political affiliations of the populations being destroyed. Let us hope in unison and send forth this message from Mumbai and from the land of Mahatma Gandhi."

Mr. Raj Loomba said: "There is no greater honour for me than being recognized by my own country, and by my own people. The Award is precious to me because everything I have done has its origin in the culture and value that India and its people have given me and my family. I shall treasure this moment for the rest of my life.

Mr. Loomba said that he drew inspiration for his work from his mother who, when widowed at a young age, spent all the resources her husband left to educate all the members of her family.

"To her, dharam did not simply mean a prayer at a temple. She was a devout and religious woman. Dharam meant caring for others. It meant providing fulfillment for her children. It meant providing education which would eradicate the cycle of social deprivation that the widowed family suffered. She was adamant that she would break the shackles of social exclusion and ensure that her children were educated and grew up in a healthy environment.

"It was a practical example of the strength and value of her beliefs which she often described as Dharam. This is a lesson that has shaped my life. It has stood the test of time.

"Today, the charity which is set up in her memory, the Loomba Trust, educates over 4000 children in all 29 states of India, including 500 children who lost their fathers or parents, in the Tsunami in 2004. There cannot be a better tribute to my mother than to follow in her footsteps.

"Education is the foremost thing. Education of the children of widowed mothers must remain the foundation of my charity. That is my paramount aim. In this, I am assisted by Ms. Cherie Blair, our Prime Minister's wife, and Lord Dholakia, one of our trustees, who is here today. Education must be the foundation on which we build a decent, healthy world. We can help children distinguish the right from the wrong. Education can help to break the disadvantage of poverty. It can help break barriers of discrimination. So, that is the start I have made.

"Shortly, I fly to New York. We are celebrating Diwali at the United Nations. This is the first time in the history of the UN that India's national festival will be celebrated, and the Loomba Trust is organizing it. And all the funds, which we will raise there, will be used to educate the children of poor widows in this country. I also go to South Africa. We are launching the Loomba Trust in Johannesburg. We will be starting a program of educating children in South Africa.

"I want to ensure that the UN establishes an International Widow's Day, which we have designated as 23<sup>rd</sup> of June every year. Together we can fight the stigma attached to widows. Together, we can ensure that the world will not forget them. Together, we can make the world a better place to live in. Let

useducate the children of poor widows and give their mothers a chance to live a life of dignity."

Prof. Arindam Chaudhuri responded by saying, "I have met a lot of managers, CEOs, and industrialists, but one person, whose dedication to Indian culture and ethos has been tremendous in all my interactions with him, has been Shri Nanik Rupani. I am today inspired by Shri Otunnu, Shri Hon, Shri Dillon, such brilliant social luminaries. Economists always talk about the philosophy called the survival of the fittest. But, we need to look forward to a better world which the Otunnus, Hons, and Dillons are visualizing. We need to talk about a new philosophy called the survival of the weakest. Only by focusing on the survival of the weakest will the dreams of the awardees present here will come true. And, it is only when the poor have the purchasing power that the industry can grow and be successful, and we can talk about a peaceful and equal world."

played and continues to play. "From the very outset, let me set out that a great deal has transpired in my country over the last decade. Rising from the Asian crisis, we have engendered much greater transparency and freedom of the press. In fact, for the first time in our history, we now have a directly-elected President. The centre has devolved considerable authority to the regions, and the growth rate is decent." Dr. Dillon stated that, while he continued with his efforts to bring about positive changes in Indonesia, he had been blessed coming across many great souls, from all walks of society, quietly serving humanity. "The current assembly, with so many such people, is certainly a celebration of life. Ladies and Gentlemen, you have given me such strength and fortitude today, that I will never stop trying."

**Dr. B. K. Goyal,** the next awardee, stated, "The medical profession is the most blessed profession and only individuals, by special sanction of God, become doctors. It is the responsibility of doctors to respond to their unique profession by serving the society. Dr. Goyal too quoted Swami Vivekananda, who, when asked to define the philosophy of life in one sentence said, 'Give, Give, Give'. This is the philosophy that my colleagues follow and must follow."

Mr. Toru Hasegawa began his speech in Hindi thus: "Namaste, is prakar, puraskar pakar, mein adhyaksh Nanik Rupani thatha sabhi vyakthiyoko danyavad dena chahtha hun." **Dr. Unna Huh** began by saying: One of the world's most revered poets to whom India has given birth, Rabindranath Tagore, once said, 'In the golden age of Asia, Korea was one of its lamp-bearers. And that lamp is waiting to be lighted once again for the illumination of the East.'

I have always considered that global IT education is the key to reduce information gaps among countries. As the first President of International Parliamentarians' Association for Information Technology, I put my utmost efforts into narrowing the world's information gap.

"Since I took the position of ICU President two years ago, I have been actively involved in global IT education and devoted myself to educating future IT leaders, who will contribute to narrowing the world's information gap. India has been making impressive progress, that is, over 7% of economic growth every year, thanks to its knowledge-based industries, such as the world's most advanced IT technologies in software. Moreover, by the year 2020, India is expected to take up 15% of the world's IT industry, further elevating its status as an IT superpower.

"Furthermore, India is ranked Korea's 11th export partner and 24th import partner, and our partnership is becoming even stronger. The trade between the two countries is growing fast, especially in the areas of cell phones, automobile parts, and ships, and is expected to increase from the current \$6 billion to \$10 billion by 2008.

"As a strong supporter for Korea's educational collaborations as well as technological and cultural exchanges with India, ICU is set to begin a dual master's degree program with I<sup>2</sup>IT

(International Institute of IT in Pune) next year. I sincerely hope that this dual degree program will further strengthen the partnership between Korea and India by facilitating intellectual and cultural exchanges between the members of the two institutions.

"I am certain that India along with Korea will be a Lamp of the East that will illuminate the world as the new center of global economy with its IT technologies and industry. Once again, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to the organizers and supporters of this function and all those who are present today. My special thanks go to the Chairman of Finolex, Shri Prakash Chhabria, and I²IT Director, Dr. Moorthy, for their consistent and kind support for the cooperation between ICU and I²IT and myself. May Priyadarshni Academy enjoy continued success for a long time to come and may there be everlasting friendship between Korea and India."

Chief Guest Shri Kamal Nath said: "It is a privilege for me to participate in today's Awards ceremony, especially as the awardees are from different countries and professions. Priyadarshni Academy, rightfully, over the last 22 years, has recognized those who have selflessly committed themselves to society. 22 years is a long time in the life of an institution, especially in the life of a selfless institution. How much has changed in 22 years! How much Priyadarshni Academy has changed -- from giving awards to two or three 22 years ago to a galaxy of awardees today from across the continents representing different strengths and diverse commitments to society. In 22 years, how much has our country changed!

Shri Rupani, you said that NGOs should be involved in nation building. Over 22 years, our country's growth has not been state-driven. It is non-government driven growth. It is the private sector which has been driving the growth of the country. But, most of all, what has changed is ourselves. It's not only that the world's perception of India has changed. Our perception of ourselves has changed. That's the biggest thing that is happening. We no longer live in an India today where we no longer think in terms of a better life for our children and our grandchildren. We are in an India today where we are looking for a better life for ourselves.

"How do we simulate the future? A future where a country is on a growth path as never before. When the world looks at India, the world is looking at a young nation, a nation where 60% of our 1.1 billion population is below 25 years. A nation which is not only young, but a nation which is growing younger. This devolves on us a challenge for change. Paradigm shifts are taking place. Not one paradigm shift but several paradigm shifts at the same time.

"When we look at the next 22 years, we look at them with confidence and hope, and I can only say that all those who have invested their time in Priyadarshni Academy and devoted their time to it, deserve to be congratulated and complimented. For me, it is a privilege to be here."

Shri Niranjan Hiranandani, Vice-Chairman of the Academy said, "This is the world of the bold and the beautiful. This is the new India where we can share honours with Narayana Murthy, and Kareena Kapoor, and move across the oceans to the U.S., Indonesia, or to any corner of the world.

"We have friendships and partnerships, associations and feelings which cross all boundaries, and successes and problems which are universal. This award function is looked forward to by many people to get to understand in which areas knowledge is spreading.
